Europe's 20 best glamping sites

From a plush Mongolian yurt in Tuscany to a lakeside safari tent in Slovenia, Liz Bird picks the top spots for chic camping

1 Camping Ca'Savio Cavallino, near Venice

This popular, well-established campsite, a 30-minute ferry ride from Venice, is the first to rent Airstream vans in Italy. Each of the retro caravans has a double bed with a pull-out bed ideal for two children. There's a gas cooker, storage, a private awning and decking with garden furniture. An on-site supermarket stocks restaurant, pool, kids' club and, in peak season, entertainment. If you ever fire of the "City of Bridges", visit Treviso or explore the Prosecco vineyards. Details One night for four is from £95 (pitchup.com)

2 Agriturismo Fattoria La Prugnola Tuscany

There are five luxurious Mongolian yurts at this charming agriturismo overlooking

local cheese and salami and there's a the sea and close to a choice of excellent sandy beaches. The yurts are built on wooden platforms and have ventilation holes to allow a pleasant breeze. Each comes with a shower room and decent-sized double bed with fresh sheets, plus there's a table for al fresco dining. They sleep up to five people. Details One night for two is from €47; there's a seven-night minimum stay (goglamping.net)

3 Casa Barthel **Treehouse** near Florence

artist and architect Elena Barthel designed this sleek treehouse in the grounds of the family home, a 20-minute drive from Florence airport. There's art, a queen-size canopy bed, woodburner and small kitchen. A large shower and separate WC are behind the bedroom. A tennis court, pool and dining porch with wood-fired oven are in the grounds. Shop for food in the farmers' market in Galluzzo.
